The history of the song...

The popular song "Auld Lang Syne" which is sung traditionally to mark the arrival of the New Year at the chime of midnight began as a poem many years ago. Written by a Scot, Robert Burns in 1788, the poem was set to music and became very well known in many countries around the world.

While it is most recognized as the "New Year's" anthem in the United States, it is also sung at funerals, graduations and other ceremonies which recognize the end of one event or chapter and the beginning of another. It is even sung at sporting events.

While different countries have adopted slightly different lyrics or tunes, "Auld Lang Syne" is widely thought to be about the importance of remembering and celebrating old friendships. In fact, the English translation of "Auld Lang Syne" is thought to be "days gone by", "old times", or "long, long ago". "We'll take a cup o' kindness yet" refers to tradition of raising a glass, or a cup o' kindness with "good will, friendship and kind regard." As we move forward to embrace the possibilities of the New Year, "Auld Lang Syne" reminds us to hold on to the people that hold special places in our hearts.
